General Discussion	Discussion	Action
Lead by Kereama	Things seem to be going really well. Kereama taught a group of Level 1 Steerers recently, Bex, Linda H, Jeff and Evan. What advice to give new people who are interested in steering? Any Level 3 Steerer can sign off any Level 2 Steerer, using these criteria (currently says Safety Officer). Level 3 Steerers are Carmel Barrett, Charmaine Gallagher, Eva Virtue, Gina Lyon, Karen Clark, Kereama Payn and Zoe Horvath.	Pdf to be updated to say any Level 3 Steerer can sign off any Level 2, using these criteria (currently says Safety Officer).

ltem	Discussion	Action
Learnings from Incidents	Steerers should put near misses and minor incidents in the book in the shed and notify Safety Officer if more serious. If crack in waka, put a tag on it so others don't take it out. Suggestions – Show crew what's in the bag before you go out, on Sundays too.	All steerers report all situations that can be opportunities to learn.
Major Incident Procedure	Procedure handed around, after updating in committee. Everyone agreed to it.	Kilmeny to get laminated and post in shed.

Lights	Lights – headlamps on #1 when appropriate – decision up to the steerer. Harbour Master likes lights. Do need to have extra headlamp on waka as backup if main light fails. Look at adding self-adhesive reflector tape to side of waka. Char has a contact who may have good price railblazer lights. Normal \$79 & \$44 = \$123. Discount \$105, \$210 for two. Char proposed purchasing them, 2 nd by Zoe.	John/Char to ask HM what colour tape is best. John see if lights could be installed. If so, Char purchase lights.
Radios	 Are for emergency purposes only. Should not be used for chatting. If you have a license, you can use Water Sport Events Channel 17. You are welcome to take your own radio out. Steerers should do radio check before going out, and should carry radio in life jacket pocket, as difficult to get out of dry bag in an emergency. Procedure for check: Turn on radio Turn to Channel 12 (Nelson Harbour Radio, who run a listening service) Press send Say "Nelson Harbour Radio, this is Maitahi Outrigger Canoe Club calling for a radio check, over" Receive a reply after a minute or two Reply "Thank you, out" Turn to Channel 16 Leave radio on while at sea When back on land – turn radio off and put back on charger (if light does not turn on, then it is charged). 	
Teamer Bookings	Administrators are Char Payn & Tony Davies. Seems to be working ok.	
Any new hazards?	No. Poles visible at low tide at exit of marina have been removed. There are groynes near 'Waka Landing' on Maitai River, not always visible, need to be careful of these at high tides.	Any time you go up the river, show new steerers where the groynes are.
General Business	Reminder to always steer to the abilities of the weakest paddler. For example, can ask how everyone is before going out the Cut.	
General Business	Annual waka huli practice – this does count as annual practice for a crew. Bex suggested we have a "Huli Week" in the summer. Still need to call the Harbour Master each time.	Char/John to ask HM if ok to use the radios for notifying of planned capsize.
General Business	Sheets in shed are going well, reminder to use both sides.
